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

Car Rider Procedures

For <u>2024-25 school year</u>, the car rider line will go back to the Foxland Hall Entrance on the Northside or "Gymnasium Side" of campus only.

Parents who drive their children to school will access the car-rider drop off and pick-up zone from Granny White Pike.

Parents can turn onto the road between Brentwood Middle School and Granny White Park, and they will see the new driveway.

Arrival

Doors will open at 7:25 AM at the main entrance and the gymnasium entrance.


All students will report to the gymnasium until they are dismissed to go to first period class at 7:35 AM.

8th Grade is dismissed first, followed by 7th grade, and then 6th grade.

If students want to eat breakfast, they may go to the cafeteria, but they must stay the whole time.

8th graders will not have time to stay and linger in the cafeteria once the 7:35 bell rings.

Late Start Arrival

Buses will run at the regular time.

Doors will open at 7:25 AM.

Students will be released to classes at 8:20 AM.

Classes will begin at 8:35 AM.

Dismissal in the Fall of 2024

School is dismissed at 2:57 PM.

Students will go to the sidewalk along the gymnasium to be picked up for the car rider line.

8th grade students will need to walk from STEM to the bus line in front of the Brentwood Middle School building and around the front to get to the car rider line by the gymnasium.

Buses will pick up in front of Brentwood Middle.

8th graders will dismiss from STEM and walk to the front of BMS to load on the buses.

6th and 7th graders will exit to the front of the building to load buses.

Early Dismissal

The student will be called from class when the parent or guardian arrives at school and signs them out in the front office.


Parents picking up students will park in the spaces closest to the new Performing Art Center and enter the front entrance to pick up their students.


If you have an eighth grader, please allow for additional time if you have an early dismissal for your eighth-grade student.

6th Grade Academic Classes

English Language Arts

ELA has a heavy emphasis on reading and writing. Students also participate in WordMasters to grow their vocabulary.

Social Studies

Students will be looking at World History from prehistory to the fall of the Roman Empire.

Science

Sixth grade science focuses on energy, Earth's systems, and interactions between living things.

Math Placement

Our goal for 6th grade math is to find the best "fit" for each student as they transition from 5th to 6th grade.

Ultimately, based on all the data available, when will a student be ready for Algebra I?

The following data points will be used to identify the class that is the best fit for each student.

3rd, 4th and 5th grade TCAP/TNReady scores

4th and 5th grade STAR/AIMSWEB Data

Math Placement Test

(given in May at the elementary school)

5th Grade Math Teacher Likert-scale Survey

6th Grade Math

6th Grade Math - Level 1

This course covers the state of Tennessee 6th grade math standards.

Students will take the 6th grade TNReady assessment.

Students who successfully complete this course will enter into 7th grade math in 7th grade.

Prerequisites:

Completion of 5th grade math standards as evidenced by a comprehensive review of the data.

7th Grade Math

7th Grade Math (for 6th graders)

This course covers the state of Tennessee 7th grade math standards.

Student will take the 7th grade TNReady assessment.

Students who successfully complete this course will enter Pre-Algebra in the 7th grade.

Prerequisites:

Students must have a 3-year average on TCAP/TNReady mathematics of the 85th percentile or above.

AIMSWEB scores in the 90th percentile or above

Students must score a 70% or above on the 6th grade math placement test.

8th Grade Math (Pre-Algebra)

Pre-Algebra (8th grade math for 6th graders)

This course covers the state of Tennessee 8th grade math standards.

Students will take the 8th grade TNReady assessment.


Students who successfully complete this course will enter Honors Algebra I in 7th grade. The grade earned in Algebra I counts as part of a students HS GPA.

Prerequisites:

Students must have a 3-year average on TNReady mathematics of 95th percentile or above.

AIMSWEB scores in the 98th percentile or above

Students must score an 85% or above on the 6th grade math placement test.



Things you may not know...



<u>Do you know about THRIVE?</u>

Each week academic teacher teams review student performance data to create THRIVE sessions to support students at all levels.

3 sessions a week are offered; they are 40 minutes each.

THRIVE sessions are designed each week to:

Provide Enrichment and extension activities

Reinforce important concepts/essential learning

Connect specifically with standards

Allow practice for connected to related arts classes

Encourage physical activity

<u>Did you know we have a "Parent</u> <u>University"?</u>

Brentwood Middle School's "Parent University Night" is designed to provide information, training, and resources that will support and empower parents to become leaders and advocates for their child's learning through 3 interactive sessions designed around Technology, Support, and Engagement.

BMS Parent University will:

- Increase parental involvement and participation in their student's education.
- Empower parents to become effective advocates for their students.
- Strengthen home-school-community partnerships.
- Help parents develop the skills needed to implement positive parenting practices.
- Equip parents with the knowledge and awareness of resources available to them and their students.

<u>Did you know we have</u> "Academic Recovery?"

Academic Recovery is a program in response to students who have failed ELA or Math for a nine weeks. It is hosted on Saturday morning and is an intensive time with small groups of students.

Teachers work with the small groups (2-4 students) to remediate the essential skills needed to put students on a path to success in the future.

Enhanced Student Assistance Program (ESAP)

Therapist role: provides weekly, 50 minutes sessions for students with high needs.

Traditional therapy model (intake procedures, treatment plans, and weekly documentation)
Therapy non=academic times.
This program is completely free of cost.
Referrals from parents and staff.

PARENT SUPPORT

If your child is struggling with the adjustment to middle school, parents can support their student(s) in the following ways:

Help build a routine arounds school (homework times, morning/night routines)

Weekly backpack cleanout and daily agenda checks
Have your child "show" you around their technology (Schoology,
dashboard, Skyward, etc.)

Check Skyward for missing assignments/assessments
Reach out to the teacher or grade level counselor if you feel your student is struggling

State Computer Science Requirement

Before the end of middle school, all students are required to have a computer science class that fulfills the new state requirements.

This class will focus on core concepts such as:

Data & Analysis
Algorithmic Thinking
Networking & The Internet
Programming Concepts

Impact of Computing

Not all computer-related classes at BMS have been approved to meet the state requirements at this time.

If students are taking a year-long Related Arts class, they may have to use a 9-weeks of their focus to meet this requirement.


