- Focuses on college-level research, collaboration, and presentation skills
- Rare opportunity - CHS is one of only 2,500 schools worldwide to implement this opportunity
- Requirements to earn AP Capstone Diploma:
 - Score 3 or higher on AP exam in AP Seminar and AP Research courses
 - Score 3 or higher on 4 additional AP exams
- CHS will start offering AP Seminar in Fall 2023
 - AP Seminar can serve as replacement for English II Honors (with teacher recommendation)

AP Courses

- AP Courses offer students the opportunity to to take college-level courses and exams in high school to earn college credit and/or advanced placement at many colleges and universities in the U.S. and around the world.

Dual Enrollment

- A **partnership** between school districts and institutions of higher education that allow high school students to enroll in college courses to earn high school and transferable college credit simultaneously (at the same time).
- **Steps to participate in Dual Enrollment:**
 1. Include Dual Enrollment on your Request sheet & Talk with your School Counselor
 2. Attend Student Dual Enrollment Mtg. **February 28th during ROAR**
 3. Parents, attend Dual Enrollment Mtg. **February 28th at 5:30 PM** in the Cafeteria
- **Last years DE Handbook is available in counseling**
 1. Updated copies will be distributed during the March meetings.

TENNESSEE HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

- Award amount - Up to \$4,500 for 4-year institutions for Years 1 and 2 and \$5,700 for Years 3 and 4; \$3,200 for 2-year institutions (no more than cost of attendance)
- Enrolling freshmen must have a minimum of a 21 ACT OR overall minimum 3.0 grade point average (GPA) on the Hope Scholarship GPA. This does not align to the WCCS Grading Scale that is reflected on your child's transcript and report card.
