Related Arts Selection and Sign-Up

All students will be enrolled in the following classes: Math, ELA, Social Studies, Science, EXPRESS, and Study Focus.

EXPRESS is a time to intervene & enrich students needing additional support, remediation, reteaching, or a push towards next-level learning. Teachers will create sessions that engage, enrich, stretch, reinforce, and review. Each week students are assigned sessions or may have the opportunity to choose sessions that interest them.

Study Focus is another opportunity for students to get support from their teachers while they start working on homework.

In addition to these 6 classes, students will also have the opportunity to take another class of their choice each day. For more details, keep reading!

Please note, this document lays out the options that we anticipate offering during the 2022-2023 school year. The master schedule will not be finalized until mid-summer, so the information below is subject to change.

Class Selection

In addition to Math, English Language Arts (ELA), Social Studies, Science, EXPRESS, and Study Focus, students will be able to choose one additional class. The options are laid out below. Be sure to read through this document thoroughly before making a selection.

Required Classes include Math, ELA, Social Studies, Science, Express, Study Focus

Related Arts Course Selection includes two paths: Related Arts Rotation or Band/Orchestra.

- **Related Arts Rotation** If you select this option, you will be able to take 4 of these 9 week courses during your 6th grade year: Art, Choir, Exploratory Strings, General Music, PE, STEM, Theatre.
- **Band/Orchestra** These classes are year-long class. No previous experience is required. There is a \$200 fee associated with this class.

• 6th Grade Art (9 weeks) - This class is an introductory course in Visual Art. Students will explore a variety of media, techniques, and art styles and make projects using drawing materials, oil pastels, watercolor paint and more!

 opportunity to be peer tutors as well as to develop their independence as musicians, working
 together on their performance music.
